Kiara Scott Farmer – 2024 Diners Club Winemaker of the Year

In the heart of South Africa's wine country, Kiara Scott Farmer's journey is rewriting history. As the youngest female head winemaker in South Africa and the 2024 Diners Club Winemaker of the Year, her story is a compelling mix of resilience, ambition, and exceptional talent. Born and raised in Mitchells Plain, a township on the Cape Flats, Kiara's rise to prominence is a testament to the power of determination.

itchells Plain is not where one would expect to find the beginnings of a winemaking career. Growing up amidst the socioeconomic challenges of gangsterism, drug and alcohol abuse, and violence, Kiara was determined to break free from the cycles that entrapped so many in her community.

Her curiosity about wine emerged in a most unlikely environment. "While growing up, I didn't want to be like some of the people I was used to seeing – impoverished, aimlessly hanging around on street corners, intoxicated. It was in this environment that I became curious about wine - how it was made, what it could represent," Kiara recalls.

Despite initial resistance from her family, who struggled to understand her career choice, Kiara pursued her passion, enrolling at Elsenburg Agricultural Training Institute to study Oenology and Viticulture. Later, she augmented her knowledge with business studies at the University of Cape Town's Graduate School of Business.

Her entry into the wine world was anything but typical, but her tenacity and refusal to conform to societal expectations set her on the path to greatness.







MAKING OF A VISIONARY WINEMAKER

While at Elsenburg, Kiara's talent was recognised by the prestigious Cape Winemakers Guild (CWG) Protégé Programme. This opportunity provided her with unparalleled mentorship, connecting her with some of South Africa's most accomplished winemakers. Among them was Duncan Savage, who saw in Kiara not only immense potential but also an unrelenting passion for the craft.

Under Duncan's guidance, Kiara joined Brookdale Estate as an assistant winemaker, where they collaborated on the estate's maiden vintage, the 2017 Brookdale Chenin Blanc. This wine set a new benchmark for elegance and terroir-driven complexity, establishing Brookdale as a rising star in South Africa's wine scene.

By 2019, Kiara had taken over as Brookdale's sole winemaker at just 26, becoming the youngest head female winemaker in the country. This milestone was celebrated widely, and in 2022, the Western Cape Provincial Parliament formally congratulated her achievements, stating she serves as an inspiration for young women everywhere.

CRAFTING AN AWARD-WINNING CHENIN BLANC

Kiara's dedication to minimal intervention winemaking and her meticulous attention to detail culminated in the creation of the 2022 Brookdale Old Vine Chenin Blanc, the wine that secured her the Diners Club Winemaker of the Year Award. The Chenin Blanc was crafted from old vines planted in 1985 on decomposed shale and granite soils, showcasing a terroir that Kiara describes as "stony and resilient."

The grapes were hand-picked in stages to optimise ripeness, then aged for 22 months in a combination of 500-litre barrels and 2,000-litre Austrian oak foudres. Despite the challenges posed by the warmer 2022 vintage, the wine retained remarkable elegance, concentration, and acidity.

Tasting notes describe the wine as "subtly keyed, with restrained aromatics of pear skin, honeycomb, and golden







citrus. The palate is deep, concentrated, and layered, with yellow apples, kumquat, and peaches balanced by a savoury finish." For Kiara, the wine reflects the unique story of the vines, the vintage, and her team's unwavering dedication.

For Kiara, winemaking is about more than just crafting exceptional wines. It's about storytelling, showcasing a specific site and vintage, and working with a passionate team to bring the vision to life.

"One of the most rewarding elements of my job is watching and guiding grapes turn into wine, expressing their unique character," Kiara shares. She takes equal pride in mentoring her team and witnessing their growth, knowing that her leadership extends far beyond the cellar.

CHALLENGES AND TRIUMPHS

As a young woman in a maledominated industry, Kiara has faced her share of challenges. However, she sees her achievements as a way to break stereotypes and inspire others. "When I decided on my career, my family wasn't too pleased. They wondered where I even came up with this idea," she recalls with a laugh. But their initial doubts were no match for Kiara's determination to defy expectations.

Her journey has also reshaped perceptions of South African winemaking, bringing diversity to an industry steeped in tradition.

CULTIVATING A LEGACY

Kiara's ambitions for the future


are as bold as her achievements. "An important goal for me is acquiring my own farm," she reveals, envisioning a space where she can continue to innovate and inspire others.


