Gâte Restaurant on-site, where inventive dishes complement the estate's finest vintages, elevating every sip and bite.

Franschhoek is another gem, known as the culinary capital of the region. Hop on the Franschhoek Wine Tram – a charming, hop-on-hop-off service that takes you to a selection of the area's best vineyards, from the classic elegance of La Motte to the family-friendly, picnic-ready grounds of Mont Rochelle. Franschhoek's Huguenot heritage has shaped its wines and cuisine, blending French sophistication with South African heart.

Paarl offers a slightly off-the-beaten-track experience, with Fairview being a must-visit for its combination of wines and artisanal cheeses. For those interested in the production side, the KWV Emporium in Paarl offers cellar tours that delve into the art of brandy and gin alongside their renowned wine selection.

WHERE TO EAT

In Franschhoek, Le Quartier Français boasts Protégé, a casually elegant eatery where you'll find refined yet unpretentious seasonal dishes that celebrate local ingredients. For a true treat, La Petite Colombe offers multi-course tasting menus that rival the best in Europe, set against stunning vineyard views.

Stellenbosch shines with Jordan Restaurant at Jordan Wine Estate, where Chef George Jardine's flair for seasonal, farm-to-table dishes pairs beautifully with the estate's wines. For an innovative experience, Dusk in Stellenbosch is making waves with its multi-sensory

approach to dining. At Dusk, chefs Darren Badenhorst and Callan Austin take you on a journey of textures, tastes, and scents in a menu that pushes culinary boundaries.

Paarl's Terra Mare is a local favourite, serving Italian-inspired cuisine with a South African influence. Pair your meal with wines from the nearby estates, and you're in for a memorable experience.

STAYING IN STYLE

From five-star luxury lodges to quaint guesthouses, the Winelands' accommodation options reflect the region's warm hospitality and rich heritage.

Delaire Graff Estate in Stellenbosch offers top-tier luxury with its exclusive lodges featuring private plunge pools and unobstructed vineyard views. For those who want a more immersive experience, Babylonstoren in Franschhoek is a unique working farm where you can wander

through their impressive gardens, relax in the spa, and even help with seasonal farming activities if you're feeling adventurous.

For a more budget-friendly option, De Hoek Manor in Stellenbosch is a beautifully restored guesthouse with an old-world charm, offering easy access to the town's restaurants and wine estates.

If you're looking for something eco-friendly, Boschendal Wine Estate offers luxury tents for a glamping experience like no other, blending rustic charm with modern comforts amidst sprawling vineyard and mountain views.

BEYOND THE VINEYARDS
